Law of Ukraine “On Electronic Communications”

Based onto the principles of the EU legal framework (Directive (EU) 2018/1972 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 11 December 2018 establishing the European Electronic Communications Code)

Step towards the EU Digital Single Market

Lowering the regulatory pressure

Balancing the access to the infrastructure for providers of electronic communications networks and services

Focusing on the consumer's rights for information

Anti-spam provisions



Impact of the Law of Ukraine “On Electronic Communications” on the Internet Governance

The new law does not contain the section addressing issues of administration of the address space of the Ukrainian segment of the Internet network (in contrast to Art. 56 of the current Law “On Telecommunications”).

Interconnectivity, assignment of resources, routing and traffic transit on the Internet which are governed by the legal instruments of international organizations are **excluded** from the scope of regulation of the new law.

The rules general regulation for assignment of numbering resources does not extend to the assignment and use of Internet resources, including of IP-addresses, autonomous system numbers, domain names (para. 8 of Article 74 of the Law of Ukraine “On Electronic Communications”).



Broadband

Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine has approved an Action Plan for the Development of Broadband Access to the Internet for 2021-2022 (Plan).

The state platform broadband.gov.ua will be created to monitor the conditions of development of Internet connections and the speed of the Internet in the country. It will help to collect information about the quality of telecommunications services.

The changes are also expected to improve access to transport and electricity infrastructure. The Plan is designed to help operators to simplify access to these facilities, which will expand the opportunities for Ukrainians to gain access to the Internet. The implementation of this Plan will promote the development of many cities that will be able to connect to high-speed Internet, receive public services online. It will also help respective local authorities to introduce open data and increase digital literacy of the population in these regions.
